Chip was Jim's hockey buddy, and Jim always liked going with Chip to hockey games and other activities where they could hang out as brothers. Rita was Jim's go-to person when he had computer or phone problems that he couldn't figure out, and Jim would remark sometimes that "Rita will fix it."

Jim also loved his church family at Southside. He enjoyed taking part in the services, and I remember his prayers that he would lead. As Brother Dwayne said last Sunday morning, Jim wanted to do his best when he took part in the worship services.

Jim loved his country and served his country in the Army for about seven years. He continued to care for and honor this country as a citizen of it.

Most of all, I believe Jim loved his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I think he served the Lord the best he could, and he is now in the hands of a just and loving God who knew him better than anyone on earth did. It is Jim's willingness to obey the gospel and live the Christian life that gave him hope as he passed from this life to the next. Therefore, even though we sorrow, we sorrow with a hope that Jim is safe in Abraham's bosom (Lk. 16:23) and that his works follow him (Rev. 14:13). Thank God for His grace, mercy, forgiveness and His love.

A Great Challenge to Christians

Our challenge in this life is to make a positive difference for the Lord while we are on earth. The Bible clearly teaches us that serving God is vitally important (Matthew 22:37-40). Our main purpose is not working, hunting, texting, or

The Bible commands us to live a life worthy of the sacrifice of our Lord Jesus (Revelation 1:5). Your love for the Lord will lead you to faithful Christian living.
