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Thoughts from Bill:

The Importance of Love

1 John 3:11-24

Love could be called the “acid test” of Christianity. Love offers undeniable proof that one is a Christian. Love is important as pointed out by a writer named C.M. Pentz who said: Love changes man’s: (1) heart, (2) home, (3) habits. Love causes man to have: (1) Christian actions, (2) Christian ambitions, (3) Christian attitudes, (4) Christian affections.

John in verses 11-18 of our text speaks of the *principles of love*. He first offers the command of love when he says in verse 11 that the *message from the beginning was to love one another*. However, he focuses his attention on Cain’s murder of Abel in verse 12. Cain is said to have been of the “wicked one” and to have killed Abel because Abel’s works were righteous, and Cain’s were evil. John offers another

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principle when he reminds Christians again *that the world will hate* them and that this is proof they have passed from death to life (vs. 13-14). Verse 15 says: "Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him." Another principle of love is found in verse 16 when John writes that *Christ died for us, and we ought to be willing to lay down our lives for our brethren*. The last principle in this passage is found in verses 17 and 18 where John speaks of the principle of *love in action*. Verse 17 offers a scenario where someone in need comes, and we tell them we love them but do not take care of their needs because our heart is closed to them. In verse 18, John gives this command: "My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth."

John, in verses 19-22, draws our minds to the *power of love*. He speaks of the *proof of love* in verse 19 as he says that helping others is evidence that we are of the truth. The *power of love* is expressed in verse 20 when John says: "For if our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and knows all things." Are there times in your life that you have struggled with whether or not to help someone and didn't? Perhaps this is what John is alluding to in this verse as he reminds us that God doesn't look at one instance in our lives but at our whole life in general. Our heart may condemn us for the one instance mentioned, but God knows about all the other times we may have helped one another because He is greater. The power of love is also seen in the *peace offered* because we know we have done what we could and can have confidence before God. Lastly, the power of love is seen in the *promise* offered in verse 22: "And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight." While we may not understand how this completely works, we have a goal to do those things that are pleasing in His sight.

Lastly, we turn our attention to *the practice of love* (v. 23-24).

Verse 23 gives us a *command* to believe on the name of Jesus and to love one another as He gave us a commandment. Again this is *agape* love or a decision-based love. Secondly, the practice of love is also seen in verse 24 where the *evidence of love is seen*. John writes: "Now he who keeps His commandments abides in Him, and He in him. And by this we know that He abides in us, by the Spirit whom He has given us."

Again, love is one of the most important aspects of and gives meaning to what being a Christian is all about.
