### Thoughts from Bill:

*A Christian's Responsibility to Others (8)*

*Matthew 22:35-40; Ephesians 4: 31-32*

Christians have a responsibility to those both within and without the church. For believers, this is a mutual responsibility, and Christians should strive to fulfill these responsibilities towards each other. Each child of God will give an account of how they fulfilled their responsibilities to God and one another.

Christians have a responsibility to *forgive others*. According to the Baker Encyclopedia of the Bible, the word translated *forgive* in the New Testament conveys the idea of ceasing to feel resentment of wrongs and offenses; pardon involving restoration of broken relationships. Man's greatest need of forgiveness is seen in his fractured relationship with God, since God is the only that can forgive sin (Mk. 2:7). Do we really forgive someone when we harbor resentments towards

them for years without seeking a restoration of broken relationships? The New Testament is clear in its teachings about forgiveness. It teaches that in order to be forgiven we must forgive (Matt. 6:14-15; Mk.11:26). Jesus taught that the number of times we forgive someone is “endless” (Lk. 17:3-4). The motivation of forgiveness is found in the example of Christ (Eph. 4:32; Col. 3:13). The word ***forgave*** in this passage conveys the idea of giving freely when it comes to forgiveness. Can you forgive in this manner?

The New Testament teaches us that we have a responsibility to ***pray for one another***. Luke 18:1 says: “Then He spoke a parable to them, that men always ought to pray and not lose heart . . .” Paul taught that we should “continue steadfastly in prayer” (Rom. 12:12). Colossians 4:2 says: “Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving . . .” Paul in 1 Thessalonians 5:17 taught that we are to “pray without ceasing.” The word ***ceasing*** in this verse conveys the idea of continually and without lacking or falling short of. Christians are to pray for one another in this manner (1 Thess. 5:25; 1 Tim. 2:1-4; James 5:16).

The final responsibility we want to study in this series is that Christian’s have a responsibility to ***love one another***. The Bible teaches the importance of love as seen in Matthew 22:35-40. Fulfilling any of the responsibilities discussed in this series is impossible without love, but they are made possible with love. Loving one another is a “message that we heard in the beginning” (1 John 3:11). Christians are to love their enemies (Matt. 5:43-46). Christians are to let everything they do, be done in love (1 Cor. 16:14). Our love is to be sincere and without hypocrisy from a pure heart (Rom. 12:9; 2 Cor. 6:6; 1 Tim 1:5; 1 Pet. 1:22). We need to pray that we can abound in love (1 Thess. 3:12-13). Christians are to love because love is of God and Christians are of God (1 John 4:7-11). Jesus gave the measure of our love for one another (Jn. 15:12-13; Eph. 5:1-2). Do we love others in this manner?

I hope that this series on our responsibilities to one another will help us to have a greater walk with God and with one another.
