Thoughts from Bill:

The Unity and Fellowship of the Church

Ephesians 4:1-6

The church is of God's design, and its purpose is to glorify Him here on earth. However, if division destroys unity and disrupts fellowship, the purpose of God's church is hindered. This can be seen in the church at Corinth that was divided by so many different things. In this study we want to explore what the New Testament says about the unity and fellowship of the church.

The unity of the church is necessary, and the oneness of the church is required. M.H. Manser in the **Dictionary of Bible Themes** writes: "The church is one in essence, because it is founded on one gospel, united to one Lord and indwelt by one Spirit. Its unity is under constant threat because of the tendency to division that is inherent in fallen humanity, and needs to be continually maintained and actively expressed in

fellowship.” The New Testament teaches that the church is made of many individual members (Rom. 12:5; 1 Cor. 12:12, 20; Eph. 4:25). In order to achieve this unity, the church must transcend all barriers whether between sexes, races, nationalities, political affiliations, and any other difference that is not a sin (Col. 3:11; Acts 15:8-9; Gal. 3:28). The Godhead is one, and They expect the believers to be one as well (Jn. 17:11; Eph. 4:4-6). Obedient believers are saved to be united in the work of the Godhead (Eph. 2:16-18; 1 Cor. 12:13; Eph. 2:22; 4:3).

I would like to turn our focus to the purpose of the church’s unity. Being united will help fulfil the purpose of the church in leading others to Christ (Jn. 17:21, 23). A divided church will be unattractive to a lost world. A divided church will be unable to put forth a united effort in leading the lost to God. A united church will purposely lead believers to maturity that all Christians must have to be saved (Eph. 4:13; 1 Cor. 14:20; Heb. 5:44). A united church will create a church united in purpose (Phil. 2:1-4; 2 Cor. 13:11).

We now turn our attention to how fellowship expresses a church’s unity. A united church will express that unity in their mutual fellowship with God (1 Cor. 1:9; 2 Pet. 1:4). A church filled with people who seek to be like God will be united. A united church will express fellowship in being together in the assembly. The early church can serve as a pattern to the importance of assembling (Acts 2:42, 46). Being together will help one another, especially in times of persecution and conflict (Heb. 10:23-25). United fellowship comes when a church shares its resources for the work of the church (Acts 2:44-45; 1 Cor. 16:1-2; 2 Cor. 8:2-5). United fellowship helps in times of suffering (Rom. 8:17; 12:15; 2 Cor. 1:7). Finally, a united fellowship aids in shared spiritual blessings. Christianity is an individual religion, but when faithful Christians are united, there will be spiritual blessings as they look forward to the glory that is to come (2 Thess. 2:14; 1 Pet. 5:1).

May God help each member of the body of Christ seek to live for God in such way that there will always be unity in the church.
