Thoughts from Bill:

The Warfare of the Saints (2)

Hebrews 2:9-18

Last week, we began a study about the warfare of the saints where we established that all humanity, especially Christians, are to be involved in a warfare against Satan. This battle is a battle for our very souls, and Satan wants to win. We also discussed the necessity both to understand and know the enemy in this conflict. Today, we continue our study on the warfare of the saints, namely, how this battle should be carried on by Christian soldiers.

The battle against Satan should be carried on with *Christ as the captain or pioneer (NET) of our salvation* (Heb. 2:10). The word captain in Hebrews 2:10 conveys the idea of founder or originator in the Greek language. Truly, Christ is the founder of our salvation: He “tasted death for everyone” (v. 9). He also sanctified us and destroyed our enemy Satan whose most

powerful weapon is death itself (v. 14). Christ is the captain of our salvation because He suffered for us (v. 10), He endured for us (Heb. 12:2), and He redeemed us by His own blood (1 Pet. 1:18). Christians should be willing to follow Christ their captain wherever He leads.

Second, the warfare of the saints should be carried out *with an earnest and steadfast faith* (Jude 3; 1 Tim. 1:18,19; 1 Pet. 5:9; Heb. 10:23). Christians need to realize the battle against Satan sometimes will be intense. Christians need to believe they can overcome and win their personal battles against the evil one.

The warfare against Satan should be carried out with *watchfulness, vigilance, and seriousness or sobriety* (1 Cor. 16:13; 1 Thess. 5:6; 1 Pet. 5:8; Rev. 3:3). The word *watch* means to be on alert and be awake. Falling asleep while on duty is a serious offence in any army because it could result in a surprise attack by the enemy resulting in death and defeat. The same is true in the Christian's battle against Satan. Being vigilant conveys the exact same meaning as being watchful. Christians should be serious or, as Peter says, be sober in their warfare against Satan.

The Christian's warfare should be carried out with *self-denial*. When one enlists in the armed forces, they immediately begin a journey of self-denial. So to speak, they are not their own person any longer. Paul compared the Christian life to a race where Christians strive after an imperishable crown (1 Cor. 9:24-27). As any good runner will tell you, if you are going to try to win a race, you must deny yourself of certain things. You must discipline yourself as Paul indicates in verse 27. A Christian must be willing to deny all to be a good soldier of Jesus Christ (Lk. 9:23-24). A soldier will endure hardships and must be willing to deny themselves of easier times (2 Tim. 2:3,10). They cannot become entangled with "the affairs of life" (2 Tim. 2:4).

Finally, the warfare of the saints should be carried out with *great confidence in and prayer to God* (Psalms 27:1-3; Lk. 18:1; Eph 6:18). God wants us to ask in faith on the battlefields of life.
