Thoughts from Bill:

Hopelessly Devoted to God *Job 23:8-15*

The song "*Hopelessly Devoted to You*" was written and composed by John Farrar and originally recorded by Olivia Newton-John in 1978. It is an expression of love and devotion between two individuals. God's people are to be hopelessly devoted to Him even during difficult times as expressed in our text. Job was suffering unimaginable grief and pain at the hands of Satan but supposing his troubles came from God. Even though Job could not perceive the presence of God, he maintained his steadfastness to Him as expressed in verses 10-12. In this lesson we want to explore our devotedness to God.

One's devotion to God should be grounded upon several different things. Paul in commanding Christians to

be living sacrifices to God in Romans 12:1, which is the highest level of devotion, appealed to the mercies of God, highlighted by Christ's death on the cross while we were yet sinners (Rom. 5:8). Our devotion to God should be grounded upon the goodness of God as Samuel taught in 1 Samuel 12:24: "Only fear the Lord and serve Him in truth with all your heart; for consider what great things He has done for you." Devotion should be grounded upon all the good things that God has done and provided for His people at all times during their lives, especially in their "Golden Years" (Psalms 86:9-10; James 1:17; Isa. 46:4). Finally, our devotion to God should be grounded in our redemption from sin by the blood of Christ (1 Cor. 6:19-20).

Our devotion to God should involve several aspects of our lives. We should be devoted to God with our spirit and our bodies (1 Cor. 6:20; 1 Pet. 4:6; Rom. 12:1). Every aspect of our lives should be devoted not to sin, but to God (Rom. 6:12-14; 1 Pet. 4:6). Our substances should be devoted to God, motivated by our desire to first offer ourselves to Him (Ex. 22:29; Pro. 3:9; 2 Cor. 8:5). Christians should be devoted to God without hesitation and without reserving any allegiance to anyone else but God (Matt. 6:24; Lk. 14:33). Our devotion to God should be expressed in both life and death (Rom. 14:8; Phil. 1:20).

We conclude our study by exploring some areas where one's devotion to God should be exhibited. Devotion needs to be seen in our: (1) Expression of love to God (Deut. 6:5); (2) Walking worthy of God (Eph. 4:1; Col. 1:10; 1 Thess. 2:12); (3) Doing all to God's glory (1 Cor. 10:31); (4) Willingness to bear the cross with self-denial as we live for Christ with a willingness to give our all to the Lord (Mark 8:34; 2 Cor. 5:14; Matt. 19:29-30).

Based on the teachings of this lesson, are you hopelessly devoted to God?
