Thoughts from Bill:

Glorifying God

Leviticus 10:1-3; Psa. 86:7-12; 1 Chron. 16:28-29

The texts for this lesson make it truly clear that God is to be glorified. Even when Nadab and Abihu were struck dead by God for offering strange fire before the Lord, Aaron held his peace because he knew they had failed to glorify God. In this lesson, we begin a series on glorifying our God in heaven.

God is to be glorified because it is commanded and glory is due Him. 1 Chronicles 16:28 informs us that all the families of the peoples are to give to the Lord glory. Why? The answer lies in the fact that God is Father and creator of all nations (Eph. 4:6), and His creation knows this (Acts 17:28; Rom. 1:20). The Psalmist writes in Psalms 19:1: "The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament shows

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His handiwork.” If the heavens of earth declare God’s glory, shouldn’t we, God’s special creation, do so as well? 1 Chronicles 16:29 declares that we are to give God the glory due His name and worship Him. Psalms 29:2 and 96:8 also declare that we give God the glory due His name and worship Him.

The various attributes or characteristics of God require us to glorify Him. God’s **holiness** requires that we glorify Him. The throne room scenes in Isaiah 6 and in Revelation 4 speak of those surrounding God’s throne as giving the glory due Him by declaring His holiness. Psalms 99:9 exclaims: “Exalt the Lord our God, And worship at His holy hill; For the Lord our God is holy.” Revelation 15:4 declares: “Who shall not fear You, O Lord, and glorify Your name? For You alone are holy. For all nations shall come and worship before You, for Your judgments have been manifested.” God’s **mercy** also demands our glorification of Him. Psalms 115:1 says: “Not unto us, O Lord, not unto us, But to Your name give glory, Because of Your mercy, Because of Your truth.” Paul in Romans 15:9 said the Gentiles were able to glorify God for His mercy because of God’s promise to Abraham. Both the Hebrew and Greek words translated mercy in these passages convey loyalty, graciousness, benevolence, mercy, and compassion. The **faithfulness of God** both in word and deed should lead us to glorify Him. Moses declared in Numbers 23:19: “God is not a man, that He should lie, Nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?” God’s very nature in that He cannot lie (Heb. 6:18) guarantees His faithfulness to us. The **wondrous works** of God should motivate us to glorify Him. Isaiah 25:1 declares: “O Lord, You are my God. I will exalt You, I will praise Your name, For You have done wonderful things; Your counsels of old are faithfulness and truth.” Exodus 15:11 and Psalms 98:1 speak of God’s wondrous works. The **deliverance** of God is another justification for our glorification of Him. Psalms 34:17 declares: “The righteous cry

out, and the Lord hears, And delivers them out of all their troubles.” How many things has God delivered you from in your life? Has He delivered you from sickness, sorrow, difficulties, and other struggles you have faced in life? God can deliver us from the guilt of sin if we obey Him (Rom. 6:18; Jn. 8:36). Since God can set us free from sin, He can deliver us from death itself because Christ overcame death once and for all (Jn.14:19; Acts 2:24; Rev. 1:18).

May God help us to glorify Him!!!
