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was the Christ, the Son of God. They should know that God was working in all of the things which Jesus had been doing during His life. They had been wrong about who Jesus was. They had sinned. When the guards returned early Sunday morning to those who had told them to guard the tomb and told of the angels and earthquake, it shows that Jesus had risen, true to His own words. However, they refused to acknowledge Him as God's Son.

What would it mean to the Gentiles? In the resurrection was the proof that He was God's Son and the Savior of the world. The idols which the Gentiles had been worshiping were not God and did not represent any divine being. It meant that the worship of these was vain. Paul expressed this to the people of Lystra, saying, "Men, why are you doing these things? We are also men of the same nature as you, and preach the gospel to you in order that you should turn from these vain things to a living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and all that is in them" (Acts 14:15).

What does it mean to us today? For me it means that God has shown His great love for all, and this includes me. I can have salvation from sin. For some it has no meaning at all because they refuse to accept His resurrection as fact. They refuse to really consider all the evidence which God has given. I pray that you will accept the fact of His resurrection and live according to His teaching, so you can have a home in heaven.
